

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) 2020-2021

For this academic year, twenty pupils have been allocated the Pupil Premium Grant. The amount of pupil premium grant received in September 2020 was £28, 685. 27% of pupils receive free school meals or have received them during the past six years. In this cohort, we have four CLA pupils and their pupil premium plus funding varies, according to the funding from their respective Local Authorities. We also have an AFC pupil who has received £2,345 and one services child who receives an extra £310. For the majority of pupils at Cherry Trees School, there are significant barriers to learning and achievement and we are using our PPG to try to reduce the negative impact of some of these barriers, increase access to differentiated and appropriate curricula, and raise the levels of attainment and progression for all.
