#### Headteacher's message: Laura Slinn

I am pleased to share that we will be returning to full opening on Monday 8th March 2021 – this will be all of the children returning to their normal classes, with their normal teaching staff – which we are so pleased about – we will continue to work in our current bubble system. We hope that we will be able to stay fully open moving forward, but ask for your help in achieving that. To keep us all safe we ask that the following guidance be adhered to:

- Parents who bring their children to school will need to arrive on site at 9:15 please do keep to social distancing from each other and the wearing of face masks for adults is required.
- Children who attend school on the Local Authority transport will arrive at school for 9:00 and will be taken in to school by designated class staff.
- Parents who collect their children will need to do this at 2:45 (we will look to extend this following the Easter break). All adults please keep to social distancing and wear a facemask.
- Children who are collected by the Local Authority transport will leave school at 3:00.
- Lunch times will take place in the children's classrooms, not the hall this will mean less mixing for the children, and better cleaning control of the shared environment. We will be returning to our access to hot school meals and children who are eligible for free school meals will be able to have this provided by school.
- We will be taking part in recovery curriculum activities, which focus on developing independence, social and academic skills that may have been impacted through this period away from school. We will be requesting that children very regularly wash their hands.
- Please keep the items that your child brings in to school to a minimum and things that are cleanable.
- If children are unwell before they come in to school, displaying temperature, coughs or loss of sense of taste or smell please have your child tested for COVID-19 and isolate at home for 10 days do let school know.
- If your child displays some of the lesser symptoms stomach ache, aches and pains, sore throat, runny nose, sneezing, headache, unusually tired or vomiting please ensure that your child does not come in to school until they have received a COVID-19 test with a negative result. Please keep school informed about all of this. This measure has come from the learning we have gained as a school from our previous positive cases we hope by us all supporting this, we will reduce the amount of single class closure that we have experienced.
- Do please take a moment to look at the risk assessment on the school website.




Following recurring press reports about the **dangers of Omegle** we are sharing an updated safeguarding alert to make you aware of a likely **increase in interest** on this platform.
