

## Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) 2019-2020

Twenty-one pupils were allocated the Pupil Premium Grant in September 2019. The amount of pupil premium grant received in September 2019 was £25, 304. 29% of pupils received free school meals or have received them during the past six years. In this cohort, we had four CLA pupils and their pupil premium plus funding varied, according to the funding from their respective Local Authorities. We also had an AFC pupil who received £2,300 and two services children who received an extra £300 per pupil. For the majority of pupils at Cherry Trees School, there are significant barriers to learning and achievement. We used our PPG to try to reduce the negative impact of some of these barriers, and raise the levels of attainment and progression for all pupils in their literacy, numeracy and social and emotional development.
