# Yellow Class News

This first month has been a busy one in Yellow class! We are without a doubt super proud of the children. The children have settled in well to school life, they have adapted well to new adults in the classroom, they have developed a routine within the classroom and they have all been motivated and willing to have a go at activities.

Our English skills are split into three parts; reading, writing and communication. During our writing sessions we have been developing our gross and fine motor skills by taking part in lots of early mark making activities. Our reading sessions have been taking place in the library. We have been learning to read with adult support, share a book with an adult and with a peer. Our communication skills have been developing throughout the whole day with adults modelling language to the children for example "I want drink" using PECS or "can you help?" when needing help with an activity or a coat.

In Maths we split our learning into three parts; number, shape space and measure and applying. We have been learning to recognise numbers 1-5, we have been sorting objects by colour and size, we have also been looking at a selection of 2D and 3D shapes. During these sessions we have used numicon to support number, sensory trays with shapes hidden in them and we made shape prints using paint and 3D shapes.

Our topic this half term is Journeys, we have been different vehicles and the story The Train Ride, The children have enjoyed exploring and playing alongside each other in small world tuff trays.

The children have started back in Purple class so, so well. We have all settled together and those wonderful friendships are starting to be built already. We have certainly started as we mean to go on...We've been learning a new Makaton sign together as a class and as whole school so we are all able to help and communicate with others. We have begun our class story *George's Marvellous Medicine* and learning about Roald Dahl. The lion and the mouse, The lamb and The wolf and Town Mouse and Country Mouse have been the first three fables we have looked at for English. In our maths we have shown an amazing understanding of place value, making, comparing and ordering numbers including decimals for some of us. We also looked at the NSPCC PANTOSUARUS video completed some work around PANTS. We have enjoyed out door learning and have acquired several frogs and a caterpillar that is currently turning into his pupa/ chrysalis! Lewi and Poppy both ran our very first tuck shop which was a huge success.




