This has allowed the children to build relationships and to develop independence. The children who joined us in September have all adapted well to this change, and the majority have been completing a range of 2 to 4 activities independently! The children who have the TEACH station skills embedded, have been true role models for the new children. Well Done Yellow Class!

In English, we have continued to explore mark making in different textures and materials – the children love to get messy! We have also been developing our communication skills using PECS and using talking tins.

During our afternoon sessions we have continued our topic of Transport (Journeys) by getting creative making lots of different pictures. Street Dance and football have been a big success with the children!





It's okay to ask for support....

What is Early Help?

Early Help is taking action early to provide support where problems are emerging for children, young people and their families. Early help support may be provided at any point in a child or young person's life. The sooner the family receives the support, the sooner they are able to improve their situation and prevent the need for prolonged support.

Early Help is here to find out what is working well for families and what areas they might be worried about; it can help to build on families' strengths and identify any needs where support might be needed. It is an approach that brings people together from different teams and services who work together with the whole family. The main focus is to improve outcomes for children.

Why would I need Early Help?

The type of things that Early Help can support you with include:

Worries about your child's health development or behaviour You might be worried about how they are doing at school You might have worries about money or housing and how that is affecting you Your child and family may be affected by domestic abuse, drugs, alcohol, ill health or crime

Early Help can give you the tools to solve challenges or problems you are experiencing with help from others where needed.
