

Parent Satisfaction Survey 2022/ 2023 – Cherry Trees School Wombourne

During the 6th week of Autumn Term 2021 and Autumn 2022 we canvassed the parents and carers, during parents evening at Cherry Trees School for their thoughts and feelings about how the school is operating for their family. In 2021/2022 offered all 56 parents an opportunity to complete and return the questionnaire and we received 13 responses which meant that each response represents 7%. In 2022/2023 we offered 54 parents an opportunity to complete and return the questionnaire and we received 18 responses – which means that each response represents 5 or 6% (depending on how many returns for the question). The outline below shares a comparison of the information from these responses in 2021/2022 and this year 2022/2023 – so that we can look at thoughts over a period of time.
