We have been working hard on our new topic "Let's Grow it!" which began with the story of "Jack and the Beanstalk." We have enjoyed lots of fun 'beanstalk' related activities including retelling the story with our sensory tuff tray, counting and adding leaves to beanstalk pictures and building our own very tall Duplo beanstalks!

Our topic has continued with the story "Titch". In Maths we have done lots of work comparing length and height. We have also been learning about seeds and parts of plants. We are watching our 'beans in bags' growing now in class. We have all made cress head pots too—we are watching our cress heads growing their hair this week!

We have also been working hard with our phonics and reading and we have enjoyed some lovely Music land PE lessons. It's been a lovely and busy start to 2023, well done Blue Class!







## **Red Class News**

Wow! What an absolutely amazing start to the Spring term. The children returned from the Christmas holidays and have settled straight back into their routines and learning. They have amazed us with their attitudes to work and we are all so proud of how well they are all working and trying hard in all areas of their learning.

This half-term, we have been working on a range of skills in Maths including place value to 20 and beyond, using tens frames, money and weight. The children have enjoyed learning through a range of practical activities.



In English, we have been wowed by the children's reading and writing skills. They have read a range of books including 'Whatever Next', 'Toys in Space' and 'Here come the Aliens'. The children have written captions, sentences and labelled pictures in their lessons.



In our afternoon lessons, the children have worked so well in their Science and DT lessons.

In science, we have made wind socks and wind spinners and will be moving onto light sources including the sun and torches.

In DT, we have been designing a rocket. The children have followed a design brief and have been recording their work within their project booklet. They have so far enjoyed researching and designing a junk model rocket. They have experimented with ways to join materials in preparation for making our rockets next week.

In Maths, we are focussing on Goldilocks and the Three Bears and size ordering and counting.

#### WOW!


What an amazing start to spring term. We have been so busy over the last few weeks and we are all so proud of them!

In Maths and English we have continued our personalised TEACCH approach to develop our skills in writing, reading, communication, number, shape and applying. The children have also been accessing Bug Club phonics four times a week and this is showing in their recall of sounds and their decoding knowledge.

During our afternoon sessions we have been very lucky to visit Sainsbury's weekly to collect our ingredients for their cookery sessions and they have all been having a go at paying for it at the till with adult supervision. We have also been engaging with our science curriculum and the children have been loving exploring water!

Again, we have been very fortunate to be the third class to go horse riding and the whole team are very proud of Yellow Class. On our first visit, we went to the stables and every child put on their helmet and got on a horse! We even trotted around the field. There were lots of happy tears from our staff!

# Cherry Trees Safeguarding



Families come in all shapes and sizes. No matter how they are constructed, different services are committed to supporting families to realise their potential.

All families encounter difficult and challenging times and many will find ways to deal with their problems, getting the support they need from friends and relatives. There are times, however, when problems can seem too overwhelming to manage and support from school and outside agencies are needed.

Services will work to tackle some of the most complex and difficult issues facing families today – including financial hardship, mental health problems, social isolation, learning disabilities, domestic abuse, or substance misuse and alcohol problems.

Here are some of our parent voices who have had or who are receiving support:

"When I was first offered support from Cherry Trees School I felt like it was just going to be in school for my son, but their Designated Safeguarding Lead has been outstanding, nothing is ever too small and she has gone above and beyond with so many things. I always felt like I couldn't ask for help about any worries, concerns, or issues I had, but with the help of school this has been a lot less stressful."

"Being offered support at home was an option I thought would consist of been told how to look after my children and being told what I was doing wrong and the right way to do things. I was very sceptical about the whole process, I accepted it was something I felt I needed to do, but I was worried I'd be seen as a bad parent. How wrong was I, I have had more support from the team than I could ever ask for, they go above and beyond to help and support the whole family and no issue is too much.

There is no judgement and my children were very much involved in every decision that is made and I can't thank the team enough!"

"Nicola, the school and class team continue to offer me and my family support. They listen, they care and they will support to make sure the right support is in place for my children. However big or small they will help anyway they possibly can. I can call at any time and Nicola will come out and see us all too, she even makes time for my other children and our whole family is made to matter. I have been supported to speak with other professionals, as sometimes it's hard for me to get across what I want to say. There has never been any judgement, we can't thank Nicola and the school for always being there when we need it."

"I was really worried when my son started school as I had, had a negative experience with nursery. The school were welcoming from day one and have continued to offer support since. Class staff have worked with me to give me strategies that they use at school with my son, that I now use at home, these have made such a difference in such a short amount of time."
