

Summer 1 Green Class

Curriculum Intent

Child centered learning encompasses opportunities for pupils to learn and develop their confidence and skills through a broad, differentiated, and creative curriculum. Our philosophy incorporates flexibility in order that children can access a variety of experiences throughout their time with us. Our curriculum is devised so that pupils follow a pathway that will have the most effective impact on their individual development.

Introduction

Green class have done so well adjusting to new routine's, method of learning and are thriving through the TEACCH approach. Our focus this half term is Terrific Time Travellers, specifically the Romans. We will be diving deep into the history of Romans through art and geography.

English

In Green class we will continue with our phonics scheme 'Bug Club' a doing 3x a week phonics sessions. As well as daily guided reading slots and opportunity for choosing their own reading for pleasure book weekly. Throughout the term we will be focusing on Non-Fiction specifically Instructions: Interviews and Fiction, Stories on a Theme: Picture books from the USA.

Maths

In Green Class this term we will be exploring addition and subtraction, multiplication, capacity, time, Money – addition and exploring change and position and direction.
. These focuses will either be done in lesson time or weekly in 20/20 activities.

Terrific Time Travellers (Romans)



Science

Lights and Shadows

Investigating what we need to see objects in a dark place and discover how light travels.
Children will design a stage for a shadow puppet and discover how the light we see is really made of a spectrum of colours. Discovering what happens to writing in a mirror and how this can be used to write in secret code. Conduct a fair test between the distance of the torch and the size of the shadow.

MFL

Mr Sadler will be teaching weekly French lessons, Activities and Opinions.
. Green class will also be encouraged to use phrases in their daily routine.

Geography/ History

Romans

As our topic focus is Romans we will be diving deep into the history of Roman artifacts, the life of a Roman as a child, soldier, the foods, dress and roads. In Geography we will be comparing images of Roman buildings and areas where Roman ruins stand compared to today.

Art and DT

Roman mosaic

Pupils will explore the decorative Roman craft of mosaic and will create their own unique designs.

Music

Pupils will participate in weekly music sessions that are facilitated by our music therapist. Mr Sadler will be teaching weekly Music lessons following the Charanga theme of work.

Physical Education

Pupils will take part in the Daily Mile and weekly Physical education in order to improve their fitness and well being.
Pupils will have weekly swimming lessons facilitated by a specialist swimming instructor.
Pupils will have the option to take part in peer-massage session that takes place once a week.

In computing children will be able to explore using sound and technology and produce music through computer programming.
