In Green Class, this half term we have covered a lot of learning and made fantastic progress in our understanding. Our topic this half term was The Romans, and we have thoroughly enjoyed our history lessons learning all about how the Romans came about. We have learnt about the story of Romulus and Remus, and the vast army the Romans conquered Europe with and why they wanted to invade Britain. We have explored Roman life including the homes and lifestyle the rich and the poor had. We will be putting our knowledge to the test when we visit Wroxeter Roman City at the end of the half term, to see the building that once stood. In our Art, we have explored and made our own Mosaics, used clay to make Roman pottery and designed and made Roman shields. Finally, we are so delighted to have the swimming pool back open - Green Class did so well on the first session, remembering the skills and safety tips Dawn had previously taught them. Our last half term is jam packed and an amazing topic focus: Colour, Shimmer and Shine. We will be exploring the country of Brazil and it's capital Rio de Janeiro, as well as being able to go horse riding every Thursday.

In Maths, we have continued to develop number knowledge, shape knowledge and applying. The children have been using their exploration skills to engage in Numicon to support their development.

In outdoor learning, the children have loved exploring the environment and making their own habitats for worms! The wormeries were fabulous and children loved getting messy in the mud.

We had a wonderful party for the King's Coronation on Friday 5th June. The whole school got together in the hall, and had such a fun time celebrating with their crowns, party food and music!


