

Curriculum Intent

Child centered learning encompasses opportunities for pupils to learn and develop their confidence and skills through a broad, differentiated, and creative curriculum.

Our philosophy incorporates flexibility in order that children can access a variety of experiences throughout their time with us. Our curriculum is devised so that pupils follow a pathway that will have the most effective impact on their individual development.

Introduction

The Green class 2023 journey has well and truly started, in just 1 short half term we have adjusted to routines and taken the TEACCH approach in our stride. Our focus this half term is Happy, Healthy me. We will be exploring

English

In Green class we will continuing with our phonics scheme 'Bug Club' a doing 3x a week phonics sessions. As well as daily guided reading and weekly opportunities to choosing their own reading for pleasure book..

Throughout this term we will be focusing on Fiction: Stories on a theme and Poetry: Poems about Monsters.

Maths

In Green Class this term we will be exploring measure specifically length.. We will also focus on halving and doubling. As well as 3D shapes and shapes and patterns.

To top it off we will look at a method of addition and subtraction to support our workings out

. These focuses will either be done in lesson time or weekly in 20/20 activities.

Science

Circuits and Conductors

This term we will become electricity experts! We will use scientific language to investigate safety with electricity. Explore everyday electrical appliances, mains or batteries and use our skills to make a working circuit.

MFL

Mr Sadler will be teaching weekly French lessons on numbers 1-10, age and Christmas! Green class will also be encouraged to use phrases in their daily routine.

Geography/ History

The Victorians

Green class will be diving into the world of the Victorians looking at the life of Queen Victoria and other famous Victorians by plotting key life events onto timelines. We will also be looking at Victorians school life and poverty of school children in the Victorian ages.

Art and DT

L.S. Lowry

We will be exploring the work of the Artist L.S. Lowry. During this we will look at the colours and tones he used by using charcoal, pencils, crayon, chalk, pastels and pens.

Music

Pupils will participate in weekly music sessions that are facilitated by our music therapist. Mr Sadler will be teaching weekly Music lessons following the Charanga theme of work Pulse and Pitch.

Physical Education

Pupils will take part in the Daily Mile and weekly Physical education in order to improve their fitness and well being.

Pupils will have weekly swimming lessons facilitated by a specialist swimming instructor.

Pupils will have the option to take part in peer-massage session that takes place once a week.
