November has been an exciting and busy month for us as we moved back into our lovely classroom! All our children are enjoying playing and learning together in our fabulous new space.

So far this term we have participated in learning about several special calendar events -Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, Children in Need Day and Anti-Bullying/Kindness week. Our topic this half term is called 'Celebrate Good Times' and our learning is now focused around the theme of Christmas. We have enjoyed the story of 'Hansel and Gretel' and now 'Mog's Christmas'. We are beginning to make some special Christmas surprises!

In Maths, we have been sorting and matching topic-themed items and exchanging coins to buy things for our teddies. We have continued to explore colour, colour mixing and texture through our creative activities and are now exploring the special properties of gold and silver. Everyone has enjoyed exploring a new environment in our Outdoor Learning sessions where we have made collections of all the different natural objects we could find.

We all continue to be very proud of our children and their achievements. They did so well in our temporary Hall classroom and have been amazing with our move back into the new classroom. Well done everyone!







# **Red Class News**

Red Class have settled well into the new classroom. We have been enjoying having more space inside and out and exploring more of the resources which had been stored away.

This half-term, we have been continuing with our Phonics learning and our English writing skills.

We have been looking at subtraction, length, doubling and halving in our Maths sessions.

During afternoons, we have explored electricity, the art work of Georgia O'Keeffe, using ICT to create multimedia work and different places of worship.

As you can see, we have created some wonderful pieces of work and we even took a trip out to our local church.







### **Orange Class News**

Firstly, I want to start by saying thank you for welcoming me to Orange Class and being so amazing. It was lovely to meet some of you on Parents' Evening and I hope you can all come and see our amazing new room. If I could go back and take photos of their faces when the children first walked in, I would - it was something I will never forget, and I can confidently say they have thrived in this new space. This half term we have started our focus on 'Planes, Trains, and Cars'. In English, we have done many activities around the nursery rhyme 'The Wheels on the Bus', and we are now starting our new book 'You Can't Take an Elephant on the Bus'. In Maths, we have been practicing our skills of stacking, understanding one or lots of an amount and looking at empty or full. In PSHE, we are working on understanding the community we are in within school, family, and the local area. In R.E. we are looking at the importance of light in different religions. Finally, we have been really enjoying our cultural capital work by growing our independence, looking at special events, and we will soon be going out into the community.







## **Green Class News**

In Green Class this half term, we have started our new topic 'Victorian Wonderland', and we have been learning about the life of Queen Victoria and have role played her Coronation. In English, we have been reading and comparing books about mischievous animals, composing sentences and using full stops and question marks. In Science, we have been looking at electricity and making simple circuits trying to make a light bulb come on.

In Art, we are looking at the artist, Lowry, and have been mixing new colours using only the three primary colours and creating a painting using perspective.

Yellow Class have been super busy with lots of cultural capital activities; horse riding, busy buildings linked to our topic, swimming and dog therapy! Throughout each of the activities the children have shown great attitudes through the engagement model principles; initiation, exploration, anticipation, persistence and realisation. I could not be more proud of each of them.


Our topic this half term is Winter festivals of light, we have focused our English work around the story 'Ella's Night Lights' where children have explored a sensory tuff tray, role play area and have ordered key elements of the story.

In Maths, children have been developing their number knowledge, shape knowledge and they have also been applying their skills to measure weight and volume - measuring volume has been discretely taught by using the swimming pool and different size containers.

Throughout our topic afternoons, we have been exploring the season, Winter. Children have explored ice, icing sugar, shredded paper and made igloos with sugar cubes.

I cannot wait to see how the rest of the half term continues and how the children continue to grow building relations and interacting with each other!

Every child has been sent home with 'A Special Message' so please look out for these in school bags.


















Dear Parents/Carers,
