Our topic for this half term is "Welllies, Brollies, Sunhats and Lollies". We started our learning with the story of Kipper's Snowy Day and have had lots of fun exploring 'snow', ice and water. We were lucky that we did have a small sprinkling of real snow to experience! Sadly not enough to make a snowman but enough to make patterns and write our names in the tuff tray. Everyone really enjoyed looking at our different shaped ice blocks and trying to retrieve hidden items from within the ice.

This week our learning has been focused around a story about a stormy day. We have been mixing paint colours to make 'storm cloud' grey and exploring capacity/full and empty in Maths.

Orange Class News

What a fantastic start to the New Year we have had. Orange Class have demonstrated that the skills they learnt before Christmas have stayed with them and they continue to demonstrate super listening and focus. We have recently enjoyed learning around the book 'Dear Zoo' which links to our Zoo topic focus. We have been exploring sounds from animals and nature in Phonics, and have also been creating our own vision of the story of which animals we would send back or keep. In Maths, we are growing our 1:1 correspondence skills, selecting appropriate shapes and comparing contrasting weights. Our Art is all things safari as we having been threading lion manes, matching patterns to animals, and painting and tracing over animal paw prints. We are also looking forward to our upcoming trip to the Safari Park to see all the animals we have been learning around.







Green Class News

Green Class have all worked so hard since we have returned in January. We have enjoyed growing plants from seeds and experimenting with the best conditions for them to grow. In Maths, we have been working on our addition and estimating skills and in English we have been looking at instructional texts and our use of bossy words.

We have created some amazing work in Art in the style of Gisueppe Archimboldo using fruit and vegetables to create portraits. In our topic work we have been taste testing new fruits and finding out about the countries these come from. We have been showing off our computing skills and have been using different programmes to create pictures, videos and powerpoints.

I am so proud of everyone in Green Class - a big well done!

We also had dry spaghetti and hoops for the 'how many?' challenge, 'Guess the Flavour of the Noodles' and 'Can You Peel an Orange?' In Maths, we have been looking at addition and subtraction, place value-making and ordering numbers from smallest to largest, capacity and focused a lot on handling data during our 20/20 sessions.

Haven't we done so much in just 3 weeks!! I am super impressed and cannot wait for the rest of this term. Well done once again Purple Class!



Anti-Bullying!!

If you are worried about bullying, please talk with a member of our Senior Leadership team, class teacher or another member of staff. Staff cannot deal with bullying if they are not aware of difficulties individuals are facing. We will not tolerate bullying at Cherry Trees School. Staff will always find time to speak with you as parents/carers, as the children are always our highest priority.

A good definition of bullying is:

"Repeated intimidation of a victim that is deliberately carried out in order to cause physical or emotional hurt"

Using this definition any of the following could be bullying if they are carried out repeatedly:

Name calling

Making fun of another person

Leaving people out

Physical Assault

Insulting another person's family or culture

Making threats

In any case of bullying, once the school has been informed of a bullying incident, it will be investigated promptly. Parents/carers of all pupils involved will be informed of the outcome.

Cherry Trees School wants to ensure that all pupils know how to report bullying and get help and that all members of the school's community are confident that the school's response to bullying is effective.

Children take part in numerous activities throughout their learning, covering a range of different topics to promote kindness, positive friendships, inclusion, anti bullying etc. As a school we continually promote **it's ok to tell**, **if something is worrying you or upsetting you- Tell an adult or a friend so that something can be done.**


The children also take part in an annual Wellbeing Survey. This is to ensure that they can voice their opinion about Bullying.
