It is our policy that all wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

The aim is that pupils of Cherry Trees School will develop and feel a sense of community and belonging through the wearing of the school uniform.

From time to time, some issues of safety and comfort for individual pupils which may necessitate some changes to the normal uniform can be taken into consideration. No jewellery should be worn in school at any time, except watches. Apart from the danger aspect of earrings and rings, the loss of such items can cause unnecessary upset to the child.

The school asks that the uniform detailed below be followed:

Our school has a dress code/uniform. Recommended items of clothing are as follows:

Forest School

During Forest School lessons pupils are advised to wear a coat, hat and gloves in the cold weather and a sun hat in the summer. Wellies and waterproof clothing are provided by the school although pupils can bring their own if preferred.

All articles of clothing should be clearly marked with the child's name. We encourage independence at every stage so children will be learning to put on and take off their own coat, uniform, socks and shoes when getting dressed for different sessions – this can sometimes mean that uniform gets mixed up with other children.
