

Autumn 2 Green Class

Curriculum Intent

Child centered learning encompasses opportunities for pupils to learn and develop their confidence and skills through a broad, differentiated, and creative curriculum. Our philosophy incorporates flexibility in order that children can access a variety of experiences throughout their time with us. Our curriculum is devised so that pupils follow a pathway that will have the most effective impact on their individual development.

Introduction

We have had a fantastic start to our academic year already and have all settled with the routines and expectations of Green class. This half term our topic focus is 'Journeys'. We will be exploring maps and directions, planning journeys and looking at different types of transport.

English

In Green class we will continue with our phonics scheme 'Bug Club' completing 3x weekly phonics sessions.

In English, we will be using the text 'The Suitcase' to support our written work. We will also have fine motor and letter formation practice each week.

Maths

In Green Class this term we will be exploring addition and subtraction in a range of different ways. We will also look at 3D shapes, their properties and patterns using shape. We will also practice our skills with halving, doubling and measuring length.

Science

Sound

Green class will be exploring Spectacular sound. This will involve identifying how sounds are made, recognizing how vibrations travel, finding patterns between the pitch and volume of sound and the object it was produced from and recognize that sounds get fainter as the distance of the sound increases.

MFL

We will introduce new phrases and commonly used words. Green class will also be encouraged to use phrases in their daily routine.

History

We will be exploring different types of transport and the timeline of transport.

Art and DT

Pupils will be designing, making and evaluating a product to sell at our Christmas Fayre.

Music

Pupils will participate in weekly music sessions that are facilitated by our music therapist.
Mr Sadler will be teaching weekly music lessons.

Physical Education

Pupils will take part in the Daily Mile and weekly Physical Education with Mr Sadler in order to improve their fitness and well being.
Pupils will have weekly swimming lessons facilitated by a specialist swimming instructor.

Computing

Pupils will begin to understand the purpose of, and begin to independently use a range of different technology.
While doing this they will develop typing speed and accuracy to enable independent and efficient access to a computer.
